

Call for FOREUM International Fellowships

Introduction

FOREUM is committed to funding and promoting scientific research into rheumatic and musculoskeletal diseases (RMD) and has a goal to foster links between rheumatology units in different countries. Consistent with these goals is the establishment of a call for international fellowships that have the specific objective of facilitating the development of research capacity and training high-caliber applicants in RMD research.

Scope

FOREUM International Fellowships are intended to fund excellent research projects in the field of RMDs that address any basic, translational or clinical aspects of these conditions.

The call stimulates applicants conducting a research project in the field of RMDs in a host center of choice for a period of 12 months. During this time the fellow will be mentored and trained in specific techniques, models or patient data by the team of the host center that is required to successfully conduct the project.

Eligibility and requirements

The applicant must be a rheumatologist, rheumatologist in training or health professional in rheumatology, who is appropriately linked to RMD research in one of the EULAR member countries. It is anticipated that applicants develop long-term research and clinical interest in the area of the proposal that provides benefit for the fellow, the European RMD research community and patients with RMDs.

<u>The host center</u> needs to have a high-level research profile in the field allowing the fellow to be exposed to cutting-edge research technology and an inspiring collaborative scientific environment. The host center needs to be in a EULAR member country different from the county of the applicants' home center.

Participation of <u>patient research partners</u> from the host center is strongly encouraged in order to underline the importance of the project for the patients.

Budget

Fellows are eligible to apply for total funding of up to 50'000 Euro over 12 months. Full financial support will depend on the successful evaluation of a written report at the end of the fellowship. Submitted publications can be used as part of the report.

How to apply

Applications should be made electronically (email to info@foreum.org). Necessary application forms can be downloaded at www.foreum.org.

Letter of intent

All applicants considering submission of a proposal are invited to send a short letter of intent (LoI) by 5 January 2020 to FOREUM (email to info@foreum.org) accompanied by a lay summary. The structure and required content of the letter of intent are described in the 'Letter of Intent template' available from www.foreum.org. Statements for support of the application from the head of the host center and the head of the applicant's center need to be provided. Letters of intent will be assessed by members of

the FOREUM Scientific Committee and applications deemed meritorious of full application will be selected on a competitive basis. The Secretariat will respond by 20 January 2020 as to whether the proposal meets the scope, priority and requirements of the call such that a full application will be invited.

Full project proposal

Applicants selected will be invited to submit a full proposal; they will be sent the full project proposal template. In addition to covering scientific aspects of the proposal the value of support in terms of training, transferable skills, and future development of the project beyond the funding period will be important aspects of the full application together with clear evidence of support and necessary infrastructure at the host center. To facilitate review by patients, additionally a lay summary must be completed. Both forms will be provided to applicants invited to submit a full proposal. Full research proposals must be submitted electronically by 30 March 2020 to the FOREUM Secretariat.

Participation of patient research partners

Participation of patient research partners is strongly recommended for clinical research projects and should be considered for all other research projects to provide experiential knowledge, with the aim of improving the relevance, quality and validity of the research process. Participation of patient research partners would be a strength in developing the proposal to underline the importance of patients providing experiential knowledge in the research process. Evaluation and decision

The proposals will be independently peer-reviewed for (i) their scientific quality, (ii) the applicant motivation and expertise to conduct research in RMD and (iii) the feasibility of conducting the project in the respective host center. Based on this peer review, the FOREUM Scientific Committee will make a funding recommendation to the FOREUM Executive Committee, which will make its funding decision. Decisions will be communicated to the applicants by 2 May 2020.

Ethical aspects

FOREUM expects a high standard in the conduct of research it funds. For researchers this includes scientific integrity and adherence to the principles of good research practice. Patients subjected to investigation shall be included with due adherence to the declaration of Helsinki.

Management of the call

The FOREUM call and approval processes will be administered by the FOREUM Secretariat together with the FOREUM Scientific Committee. The call schedule will be as follows:
